

Production Classes Portfolio

Each student will create an online portfolio. Options: Weebly, Tumblr, or another online tool. Try to show a variety and sustained interest! Make it professional, well organized and a tool you can use to sell yourself.

Privacy rules: Do not post full name, phone numbers or address. Don't allow commenting or create a guestbook. You can make your site public or private (but if it is private I have to have access).

All Home pages should include:

- Welcome message – One paragraph
 - Who are you?
 - What is the purpose of this portfolio?
 - How does it demonstrate what you have learned or what you are capable of producing for a client?
- Goals (long term – education and career possibilities)
- Recognition – these can be nominations, awards, certifications, inside or outside of school, even contest entries
- Experience, work or volunteer experience, special travel or leadership experiences, software or gear experience

Content:

Create the following pages and fill them with examples of work that include a **description** and a **completion** date. Your description should include how the project demonstrates new things that you have learned by completing the project or skills that you have mastered.

***You must post all the current quarters work on a single web page that is clearly marked so it is easy to evaluate.**

Video

- Projects –Include pre-production documents, production stills or label artwork, video (youtube)
- Work experience – what I used to call “location shoot”
- Examples from other software: After Effects, Photoshop, Encore, Illustrator, Soundbooth, Flash

Animation

- Flash examples – animation, banners, web sites, actionScript, other
- 3D Models – Jpeg and pdf or After Effects clips
- Game dev documents and Concept Art - Photoshop, Illustrator, Drawings

Digital Imaging

- Illustrator or Photoshop
- Client Work – planning documents, comments from client

Web Design

- Client sites – planning documents, links to site, comments from client
- Concept art, banners, CSS examples
- Examples of programming
